LCME MYTH-BUSTERS

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 1

The associate dean for medical education cannot chair the curriculum committee.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 2

Assistant deans cannot have roles in summative assessments of students.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 3

We must keep students from different medical schools separated on both required and elective clinical rotations.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 4

Longitudinal integrated clerkships (LICs) are considered parallel curricula (tracks).

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 5

Only physicians who assess medical students are required to have faculty appointment.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 6

Faculty appointments are necessary only for faculty involved in the clerkship years; pre-clerkship faculty are not required to have an appointment.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 7

Healthcare providers overseeing a station, such as blood draw or OSCE, must have a faculty appointment.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 8

Non-MD and non-DO health care providers cannot supervise medical students.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 9

The medical school must have student representatives present in administrative discussions.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 10

Schools must have affiliation agreements with ambulatory sites, including physician's offices.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 11

We must have a signed clinical training agreement for every student who visits our school and for each of our students who does a clinical elective at another school.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 12

Each school must establish a formal committee to manage its continuous quality improvement (CQI) process.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 13

Each school must have a CQI office and dean or director.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 14

The charges, membership, and operational procedures of the major standing committees of the medical school listed in Table 1.3-1 must be defined in the college bylaws.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 15

The LCME requires that students have dedicated study, relaxation, and secure storage space at each clinical site.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 16

Standing committees cannot have appointed members.

LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 17

Student promotions and appeals committees cannot have members who are course or clerkship directors.

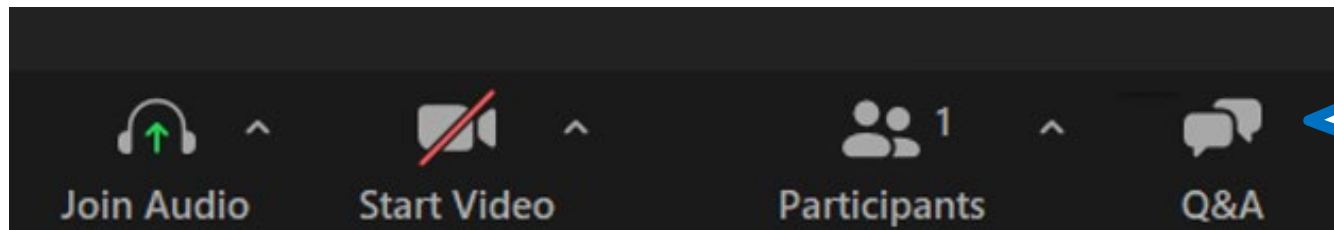
LCME Myth-Busters: Submission 18

A school can accept transfer students from non-U.S. MD granting programs.
